The Berks Art Alliance is a non-profit organization whose objective is to encourage artists by providing workshops, exhibitions, and information that will keep the artistic momentum alive and growing.

DAVID LEE: painting atmosphere, light, and the moment

David is an award winning watercolor impressionist who paints landscapes and figures. His style is loose, bold, and spontaneous. David's goal is to capture a moment in time that may invoke feeling and interest from viewers.

David pursued photography as a hobby for two decades while earning his living in insurance management. When he retired in 2002, he got back to painting with a vengeance, amassing over 50 awards. David participated in the NYC Bryant Park juried artists in residence program and was one of four artists who painted outdoor activities in the mid-town parks. David's paintings are included in the Bryant Park's permanent art collection. He also participated in the Vichy, France art residency for three weeks representing America along with five other artists, painting the French Countryside and Paris. David's artwork has been shown in prestigious institutions such as Allentown Art Museum, Bethlehem City Hall, Banana Factory, Lehigh University, and Thunderbird Foundation Fine Art Gallery in both solo and group exhibitions.



For David, painting is just another way of keeping a diary. He started using a brush at an early age to copy the Chinese characters with precision. As he matured, he painted over the lines in watercolor without regard for any rules or restrictions. That was the beginning of his loose, bold, and spontaneous painting style. "As I work", he says, "more of my past experiences emerge." Knowledge gained throughout his lifetime is present in each of his paintings. Years of practice and experimentation have allowed him to produce work that lacks detail but still retains enough representational imagery for the viewer to connect the dots.

“Two Steps Forward, One Step Back” is an often repeated bit of folk wisdom that seems more true by the day.

After a year-and-a-half of semi-hibernation we began gearing up for the Berks Art Alliance to fully return to in-person activities and events after many members reported receiving Covid-19 inoculations and early-summer decline in infections. We’ve held several plein air painting outings and the Thursday studios are again up and running. We hope these and other upcoming activities will be able to continue going forward despite an alarming uptick in the disease driven by the “Delta variant” in what has been called by some “the pandemic of the unvaccinated.”

The response to the juried show has been quite heartening. 141 artists submitted 351 pieces of art for consideration! And we have a number of new members as a result!

Plans are shaping up for the closing reception for the show: October 10. Looking forward to next year, we’ve put dibs on a space at Goggleworks for 2022, but we need a volunteer to chair next year’s show. It’s not too early to begin planning now. Several experienced volunteers have already agreed to be on the committee, but still we need someone to take overall charge. Contact Jay Ressler or Victoria Lawrence if you are interested.

At this writing we are still hopeful that our first meeting this fall can be in-person with masking required. (A decision to hold the meeting via Zoom remains an option, watch your email for final notification.) We have secured the nationally renowned watercolorist David Lee as our speaker. I know you won’t want to miss this incredible opportunity: whether in-person or via Zoom. Please visit his website: <http://davidleefineart.com/>

Since this is our first meeting in a while and we have a levy of new members, in addition to your face mask please wear a name tag so we can get to know each other or resume dormant relationships. Bring a friend!

We face some big challenges in the months ahead. One challenge is that space is at a premium. Yocum Institute is proposing a rent increase for the first time in over 16 years. An increase that will have to be passed on to the members in the form of higher annual dues. We should note here that Yocum forgave our rent for many months during the pandemic when BAA did not use the space. In the meantime Yocum’s programming has expanded to generate much needed operating capital. We are working with Yocum to streamline space utilization. We hope the years-long partnership with the Institute will continue well into the future and ask for everyone’s forbearance as we face upcoming challenges.

On another note: Jay Ressler and Victoria Lawrence were part of a group of visual artists who visited Reading Film Studios on Canal Street in Reading early in August. It’s an exciting venture led by several New York filmmaker-transplants that occupies two old factory buildings where they are constructing movie sets and sound stages. There was some initial discussion about possible pop-up show space in the future. RFS executives expressed a need to acquire a variety of art works, costuming, and furnishings (including hospital equipment) for their sets. For now, their budget is quite limited as funding dried up with the pandemic. Contact either of us if you can help secure such donations.

No, Berks Art Alliance is not ending. But, unfortunately, our low membership fee is the latest casualty of rapidly growing prices.

We have been able to keep our membership at \$25* since 2004. But due to rising rent and other costs, starting October 1, when 2021-2022 dues become delinquent, our annual dues will increase by \$5 to \$30 per year (\$40 if you want a printed Palette mailed). This barely covers our rent increase but will allow us to continue offering you, our valued member, the quality programming and services you have come to expect from us, the oldest art organization in Berks County. We look forward to many more years of supporting and encouraging artists by providing workshops, exhibitions, bus trips, and information that will keep the artistic momentum alive and growing in Berks County.



In October, Clay on Main Owner, Delores Kirschner, and Artist/Instructor, Constance McBride to talk about Art as a Community Resource and using art to raise awareness for Alzheimer's disease

Clay on Main is a non-profit art community and studio resource center that serves the local community with a variety of clay arts programs. It has community classes and workshops in clay for adults and children, host professional workshops, collaborate with other non-profit organizations to offer learning opportunities through art, and hold public lectures and events. There is also a cooperative gallery which serves as a venue for the display and sale of members' and guest artists' work, and the Half Moon Cafe, which is a venue for local musicians.

"The Lonely Girls" Project began in 2011 to raise awareness for Alzheimer's, a debilitating, irreversible and incurable disease. The project began after Constance McBride's mother moved from her home to an assisted living facility. She was diagnosed with the disease and lived out her last years between two worlds. What started as a portrait of her became a collection of works inspired by the women she lived with. One goal of the project is to raise research funding for Making Sense of Alzheimer's. A platform managed within University of Pennsylvania, it's a creative space for people to understand the past, present, and future of Alzheimer's disease. "Making Sense of Alzheimer's" features stories and ideas that tackle the changing understanding of what Alzheimer's disease is and how we try to make sense of it in our own lives.




Cold Wax and Oil Painting with Linda McCloskey


If you love encaustic, but are afraid of fusing, this workshop is for you. This is the new medium that everyone is talking about. Cold wax looks similar to encaustic. You will learn the basic techniques and build on them to the more advanced ones - layering, texturizing, scratching back, carving, adding collage, stamping, transferring, etc.

Artists in this workshop will explore methods of building up abstract paintings in layers using cold wax medium, tube oil paint, powdered pigments and other media. You will also find new ways to create textures, lines, scratching back to previous layers, adding collage using a variety of tools and techniques. No prior knowledge in using oil is necessary.
